

DYING AT HOME BUREAUCRATIC OBSTACLES

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DEATH CERTIFICATE

- EVERY DEATH IN HONG KONG MUST BE REGISTERED LEADING TO THE ISSUE OF A DEATH CERTIFICATE BY THE REGISTRAR OF DEATH.
- WITHOUT THE DEATH CERTIFICATE:-
 - THE BODY CANNOT BE MOVED.
 - BURIAL OR CREMATION CANNOT TAKE PLACE.

TWO WAYS TO GETTING A DEATH CERTIFICATE

REGISTERED DOCTOR ISSUES A MEDICAL CERTIFICATE OF THE CAUSE OF DEATH

NEXT OF KIN PRESENTS TO REGISTRAR OF DEATH

DEATH CERTIFICATE ISSUED BURIAL OR CREMATION ORDER OBTAINED NO MEDICAL CERTIFICATE OF THE CAUSE OF DEATH – REPORTED TO CORONER

CORONER ISSUES AUTOPSY ORDER, WAIVER OF AUTOPSY ORDER, BURIAL OR CREMATION ORDER.



WHERE YOU DIE

- IN HOSPITAL
- REGISTERED DOCTOR CERTIFIES DEATH –
 ISSUES MEDICAL CERTIFICATE OF THE CAUSE
 OF DEATH OR
- REGISTERED DOCTOR CERTIFIES DEATH –
 REPORTS THE DEATH TO THE CORONER

- OUT OF HOSPITAL
- NO CERTIFICATION OF DEATH BODY TRANSPORTED TO A&E FOR CERTIFICATION OF DEATH
- RARELY MEDICAL CERTIFICATE OF CAUSE OF DEATH ISSUED – HENCE CASE REPORTED TO CORONER
- OBVIOUSLY DEAD CASES DIRECTLY TRANSPORTED TO PUBLIC MORTUARIES AND REPORTED TO CORONER

WHY DOES ONE WANT TO DIE AT HOME?

- FAMILIAR SURROUNDINGS
- ACCOMPANIED BY LOVED ONES



WHY IS IT SO DIFFICULT TO DIE AT HOME IN HONG KONG?

- INSUFFICIENT SUPPORT
- FEW REGISTERED DOCTOR WILLING TO VISIT PATIENTS AT HOME AT LEAST ONCE EVERY 14 DAYS AND ALSO AT THE TIME OF DEATH TO CERTIFY THE DEATH AND ISSUE THE MEDICAL CERTIFICATE OF THE CAUSE OF DEATH.
- POLICE NOT ACCUSTOMED TO SUCH PRACTICES RELUCTANT TO ISSUE FORM 8 (SCHEDULE 2 OF BIRTHS AND DEATH REGISTRATION ORDINANCE CAP 174 LAWS OF HONG KONG)

OTHER OBSTACLES

- REGISTRAR OF BIRTHS AND DEATHS ARE NOT OPERATING A 24 HOUR SERVICE.
- TRANSPORT OF BODIES FUNERAL SERVICES ARE NOT 24 HOURS



- BETTER CROSS-SECTORIAL COMMUNICATION AND CONSENSUS ON PROMOTING DEATH AT HOME PROGRAMS.
- REGISTERED DOCTORS WILLING TO VISIT HOMES AND TO MAKE DECISIONS ON CAUSE OF DEATH OR REPORTING THE DEATH – NEEDS TO BE ABLE TO WORK WITH POLICE OFFICER TO HELP POLICE OFFICER TO BE COMFORTABLE ABOUT ISSUING FORM 8
- DEATH REGISTRY WORK HOURS (OR) DIGITAL REPORTING
- FUNERAL SERVICES AVAILABILITY FOR BODY TRANSPORT

OTHER OBSTACLES – DEATHS IN HOSPITAL

- DELAYS IN MAKING DECISION ON REPORTING OR NOT REPORTING A DEATH
- PROCEDURAL DELAYS IN ARRANGING INTERVIEWS WITH PATHOLOGISTS REVIEWING THE
 DEATH FOR THE CORONER
- DELAYS AT THE CORONERS COURT FOR APPLICATION OF WAIVER OF AUTOPSIES
- DELAYS IN COMPLETION OF DEATH INVESTIGATION AND ISSUE OF DEATH CERTIFICATE

SUPPORT

SUPPORTING THE FUTURE

- ADVANCED DIRECTIVES CAN IDEALLY ALSO COVER THE WISHES OF AN INDIVIDUAL ON HOW THEY WANT TO DIE AND WHERE THEY WANT TO DIE.
- A MUCH MORE INTEGRATED SYSTEM BETWEEN LAWYERS, PALLIATIVE CARE AND FAMILY AS WELL AS VISITING DOCTORS NEEDED.
