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Dr. Raymond Lo graduated from United Medical and Dental Schools of Guy's and St Thomas's in London, UK, and received fellowship from Royal College of Physicians, Royal Society of Medicine, and Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. He is Clinical Professor (Honorary) of Dept of Medicine and Therapeutics, CUHK, and also held visiting professorship overseas. Dr. Lo is currently serving as the Cluster Co-ordinator for Hospice and Palliative Care of New Territories East, and Consultant in-charge for Bradbury Hospice and Shatin Hospital Palliative Care Services.

Dr Lo's research interests and publications include quality of life and symptom control in palliative care, handicap in elderly people with stroke and chronic diseases, care at end of life in old age homes, and advance care planning. He has delivered invited plenaries and lectures to local and international conferences in geriatrics and palliative care, and was pioneer in developing the CUHK Post-Graduate Diploma in End-of Life Care, and the new CUHK MSc Gerontology and End-of-Life Care commencing since 2019.

Amongst his other capacities, Dr Lo is the President of British Medical Association (HK), and Honorary President of the Federation of Medical Societies of Hong Kong, the umbrella organisation of 140 plus medical and health professional societies.
